BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT September 7th

Teacher Presentations 7:45 - 8:30 pm **EC Classrooms**

<u>Space Available for 2023-24</u>: We are asking our families to let other families with young children know about our wonderful EC program. Please help spread the word and send others our way so that we can reach a full enrollment. At this time, we still have space available in our Three and Four-Year-Old classrooms. The Two-Year-Old room is full but we are happy to give tours and put names on our waiting list.

If you refer someone that registers at our school, you will earn a \$50 gift card or tuition credit!

REMINDERS:

- ◆ Extended Care is open: Students are invited to join us for Early Care (8:00 9:00am) and Afternoon Care (12:00 3:00pm) for an additional fee.
- ◆ Carline: For a safe and efficient carline, we ask that student car seats be on the side of the car closest to the building so staff can safely and easily reach them. We can unbuckle the children upon arrival but CANNOT buckle them in at dismissal. Please pull through the carline and buckle your child in the parking lot so the carline can keep moving.
- ♦ **Labels:** Pinellas County Licensing Board requires that all student items must be labelled with a first and last name. This includes backpacks, clothing, lunchboxes, icepacks, water bottles, snack containers, etc.
- ◆ Snacks: Licensing requires snack contain two food groups (ex. 100% juice box and cheese stick or strawberries and crackers). Snack should be packed in a separate bag from the lunchbox (for those children staying in Extended Care). Perishable items must include an icepack for food safety.
- ♦ Enrichment Activities: Afternoon classes will begin September 11th. Students must be enrolled in Extended Care in order to participate.
 - Monday Spanish with Mrs. Pollock (no additional cost)
 - Tuesday Music with Stretch n Grow (\$35/month)
 - Wednesday Sports with Stretch n Grow (\$35/month)
 - Thursday Dance with Stretch n Grow (\$35/month)
 - o Friday "Kidding Around" Exercise Class with Mrs. Kay (no additional cost)

Stretch n Grow is an outside provider (fully licensed and screened through the state and Diocese) who offer fun classes for children. Families pay Stretch n Grow directly. Classes are open to three and four-year-old students only.

Appropriate Dress: Parents are asked to dress their children in appropriate clothing and shoes for school. The children will get "involved" with paint, sand, etc. and they should feel comfortable to do so. Play clothes are perfect. Closed, rubber soled shoes are needed. Boots, crocks, and sandals are not to be worn to school, as they do not allow children to climb, run and move safely. Additionally, as outlined in your handbook, children should not wear jewelry to school.
