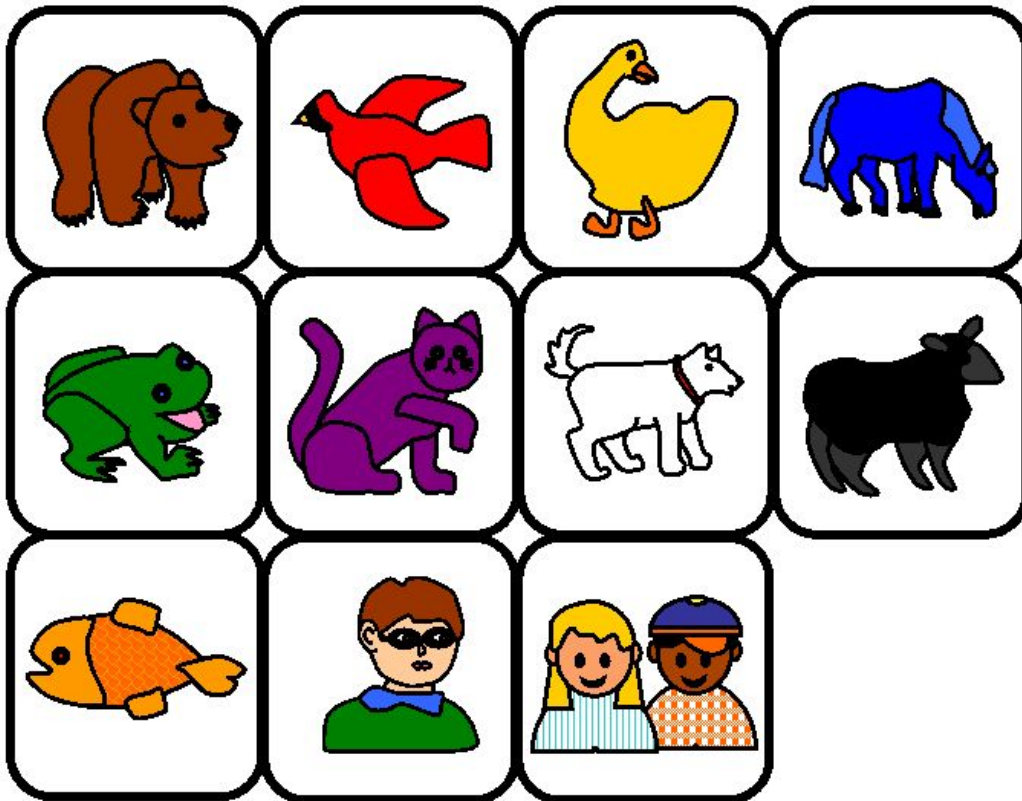

Craft: Make this brown bear with a paper plate, construction paper and crayons. Make more characters and put on a play.



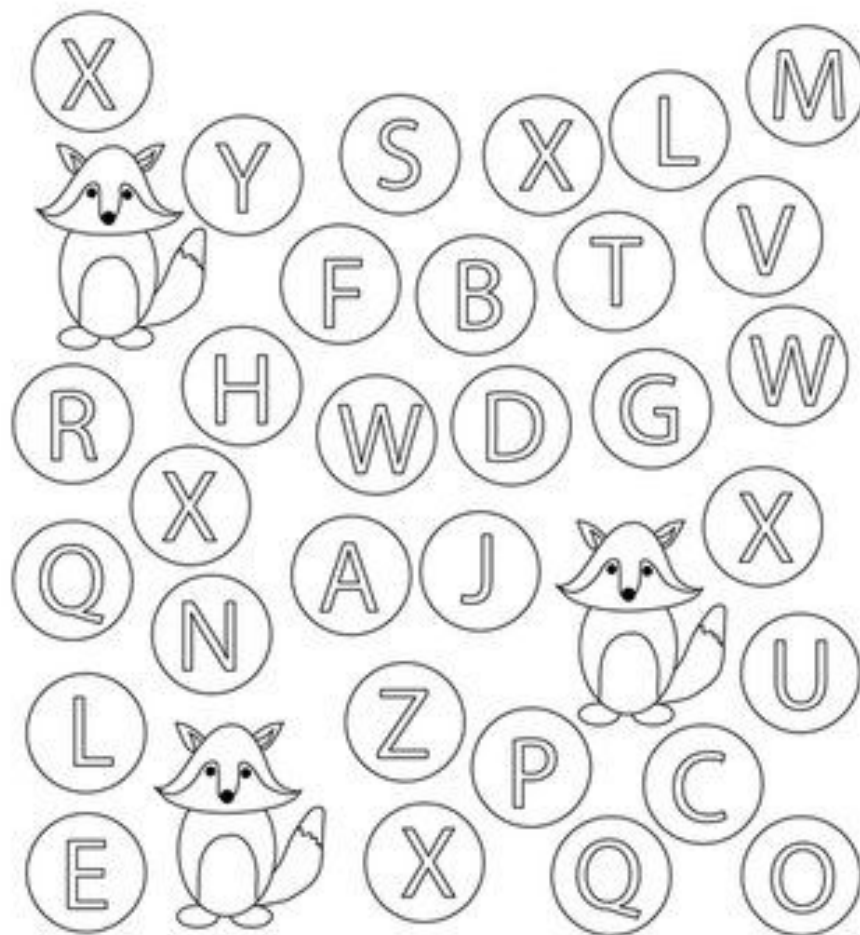
