Activities:

Sorting and Counting - Using farm animal toys (plastic or plush) or pictures from magazines/computer, sort the animals into different categories. You can use paper plates with pictures, words, numbers or dots to identify the category. For example, write the number 4 and draw four dots on a plate, do the same with the number 2. Then have your child sort their animals into the correct category by counting the number of feet on each animal. You can also sort by color, size, skin covering (feathers, fur), etc.

Building Patterns - Use farm animal toys or pictures to create a simple AB pattern. Have your child copy that pattern and extend it. (Ex. Chicken, pig, chicken, pig). Create more complex patterns for your child. See if they can create an original pattern.

I can [sound].

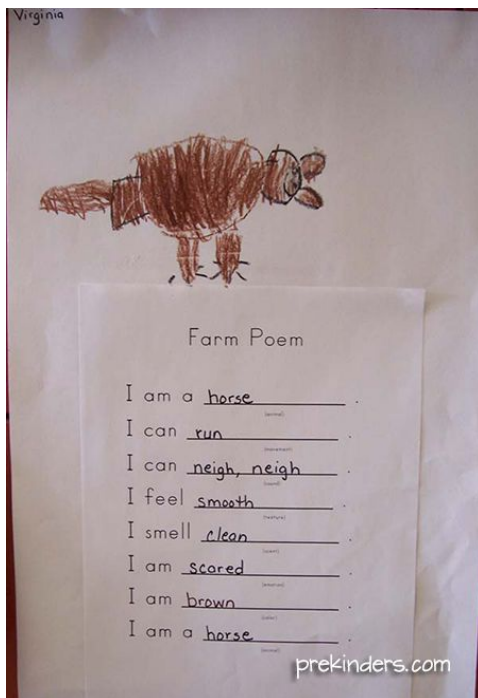
I feel [texture].

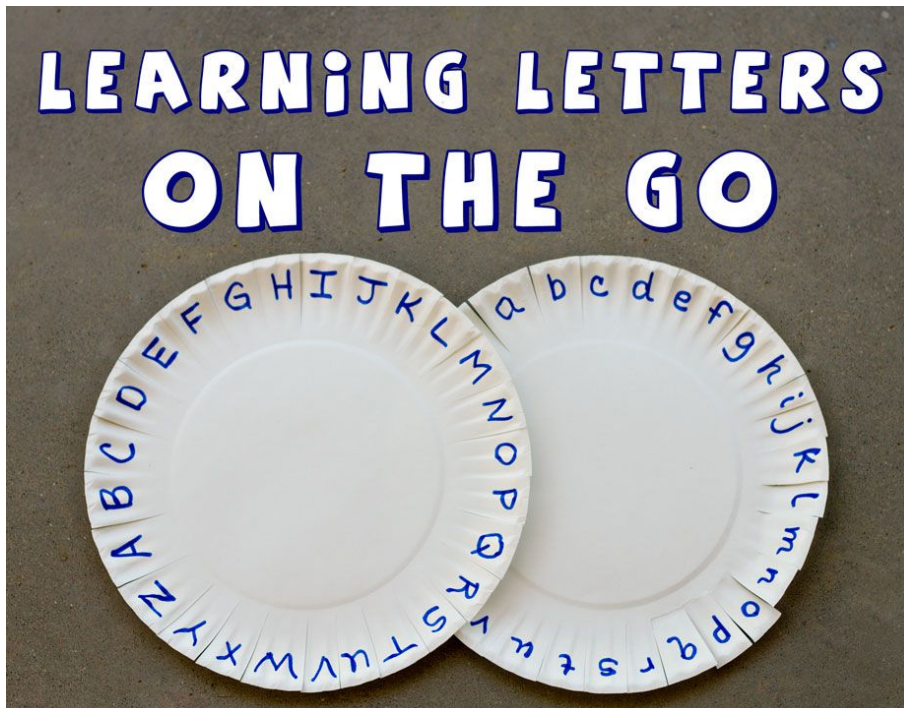

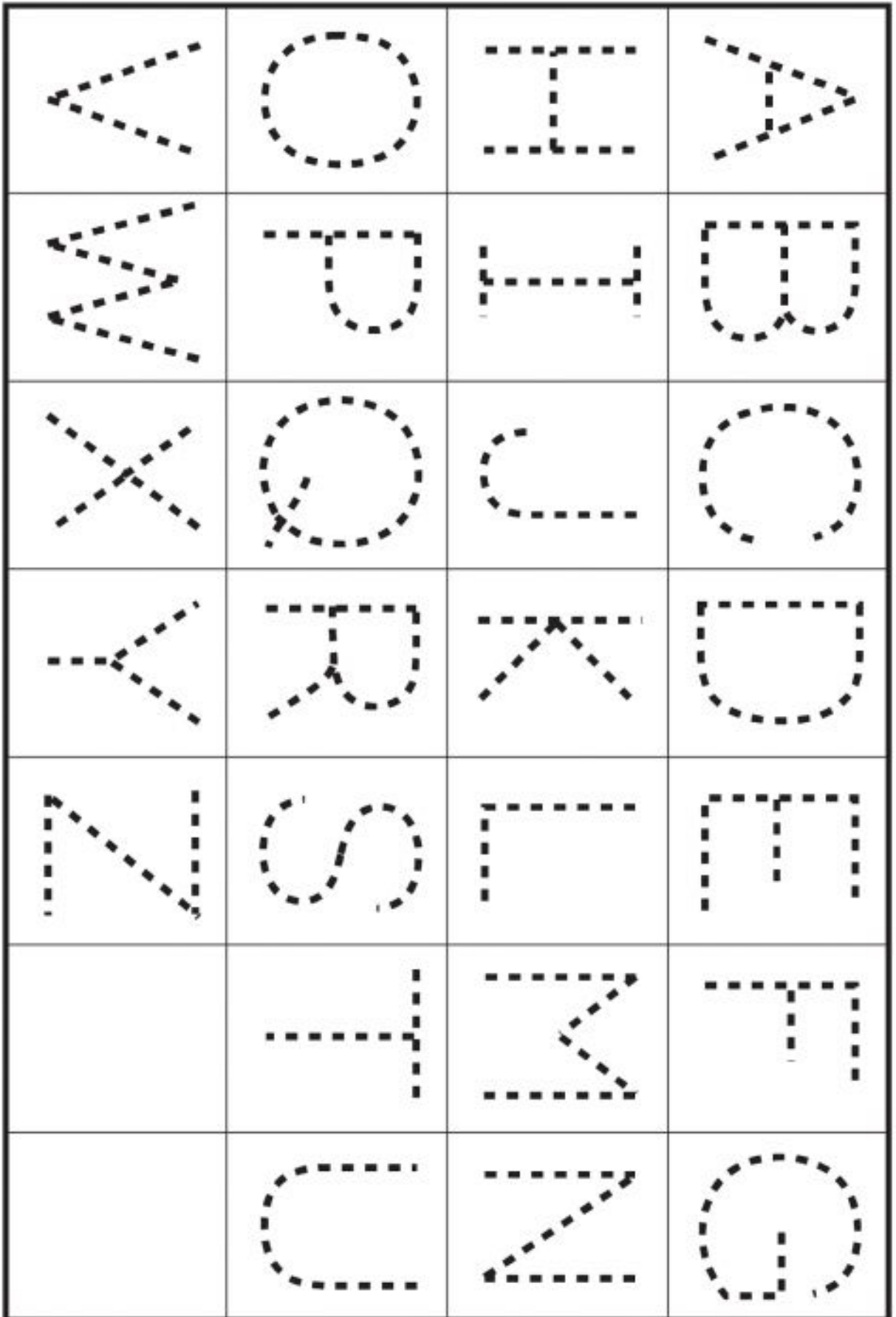
